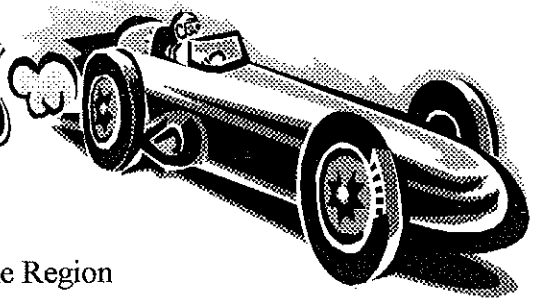

Motion to accept the minutes of the last meeting motioned, seconded & passed.

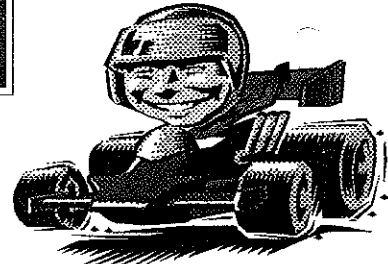
Treasurer's report: the checkbook balances at \$1222.82, with all bills paid or current. Our events have basically paid expenses if it is looked at in total.

On July 1, 01, we set up a course at the Montana Army National Guard at 2915 Gabel Road. the lot is almost perfect, with no light poles & plenty of space. The pavement is the best & we put it to good use.

Event chair was yours truly, and the course was designed by Brian Dean & Dennis McCollough. With help from others, it was set up quickly enough & then with the computer skills of Jeff Hauck of Cody, the timer was put on line & worked well. In the trailer was Char Schulz taking care of things & when Jeff wasn't racing he & his son did their turn on the hot seat! Kurt Schulz was our Safety Steward, & he did the job even though he didn't race. Thank you. Without him, we wouldn't have had the event.

Dwight & Kristi Gilliland showed up with his latest Hill Climb assault vehicle. It was wicked fast, but of course needs shaking out since this was it's first run. The course proved well suited to help out.

The intense & much talked about rivalry between the ponies of Dale Dinsmore & Ken Decker was in full swing! We added new member John Warg & his Corolla, and Jeff Hauck & his Z of another color. It was a blast having Jeff accessible to race with since his main ride, which is 6-7 seconds quicker, was left at home. Feel free, Jeff, to keep that up!

Rick Borsheim & his Cobra from Colstrip was there & so was Mr. Arnett, who traveled home from Spokane the day before. We had new drivers, wives & friends of drivers, & had a great time. Thanks for showing up & driving & helping out. With appropriate apologies for omissions & outright lies, we can now move on to Lowe's Motor Speedlotte, Char. But first, we must thank MSG Osik & the Nation Guard for allowing us to use their lot. Their facility is first class.

Lowe's was basically secured & set up by Jim & Marcie Arnett at midnight on Saturday the 14th. This has to be done, since large RV's & such vie for our asphalt. It was a decent chunk of pavement, about 200' by 400' depending upon whose feet were pacing it off. But the course was basically a figure 8 inside an oval, (check it out on the web site) which when run two laps proved to be excellent. We have some great course designers.

The big difference between Lowe's & the Armory is exposure. We had a very large number of spectators, & extra people everywhere, though in complete safety at Lowe's. 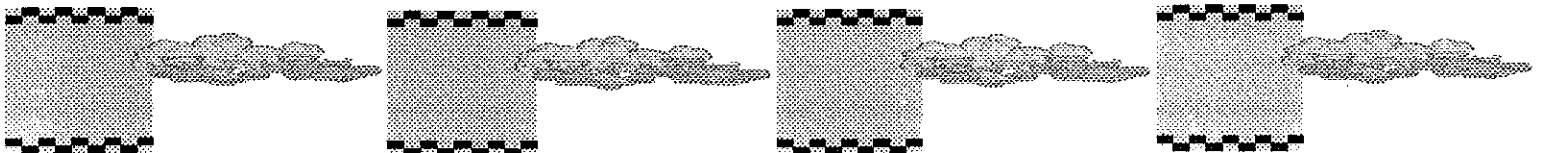

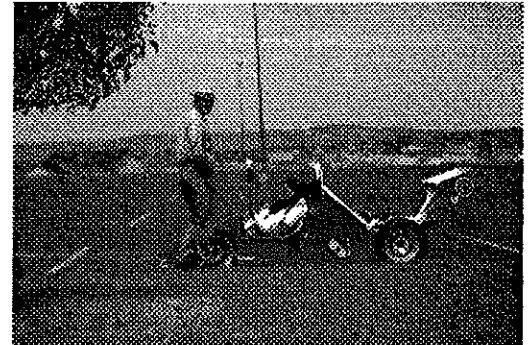
